Some aspects (e.g. PVG, email account and social media) will require active and ongoing attention; others (e.g. operations manual) are not quite so urgent. Website is now live, and initial feedback has been very positive.

CN explained role of digital champion, and noted it was not entirely clear how much access and freedom they would expect to have to Smart Village and MACDT social media. 4 applicants had expressed an interest in taking on the role of Digital Champion to ensure that the Smart Village was kept up to date. CN was not aware of the order the applications for digital champion were received, so we would need to decide on an internal process for selection.

The role of who was best placed to take on the role of Digital Champion was discussed at length and candidly by all attendees.

It was agreed that having one Digital Champion from Meigle and one from Ardler would be a good demonstration of both villages working together.

HW volunteered to be website administrator to do this as and when required but did not want the role of Digital Champion as not comfortable with social media.

KS suggested HW share the role with Alan Bell from the Ardler Tavern (who had shown interest in the Digital Champion role). KS to approach Alan and see if he can attend the training on Monday, with HW to also do the training when possible. KS to approach Alan Bell re Digital Champion role

## c) CAP

CN has been working far more than her allotted hours to complete the survey analysis, and is close to completing the stakeholder analysis (a time-intensive process as requires re-listening to all recorded Zoom calls). Similar themes have emerged between the two, with business and education more prominent in the latter.

Mentimeter poll is set up ready for people to vote on their preferred actions within each theme. QR code for easy access printed on 5 1mx1m banners (with KS) and several A4 laminated posters (with Jackie Brierton). KS and PM to place at strategic points around the two villages.
